
December Christmas Luncheon

Our Round Table is celebrating the holiday season with the Union Cemetery Historical Society with a potluck luncheon on Saturday, December 2nd, at the Loose Park Garden Center, 50th Street and Wornall Road in Kansas City, MO. The Garden Center building is a short walk to the west of the pavilion and parking lot just off Wornall Road at 50th Street. Plan to arrive about 11:30 a.m. so we can arrange the food for a noon serving. The Round Table will provide deli ham, beef and turkey and buns for a meat dish as well as beverages. We will have plates, cutlery and cups, but you may bring your own if you wish. Please bring a side dish or dessert to share.

After lunch we will have a drawing for door prizes provided by members. These can be inexpensive items and don't need to be wrapped. Each person will be given a drawing ticket upon arrival. We don't have a speaker or program planned, but the president of each group might say a few words about their plans for 2007.

December 2nd is also the date the new \$26.6 million National World War I Museum will open at the Liberty Memorial. While you are in Kansas City you might want to check it out. There will be a symbolic garden composed of 9,000 artificial poppies representing the 9 million military deaths in World War I located under a glass bridge that will take visitors to the museum. Red poppies bloomed

profusely in northern France during and after the war. The carnage of trench and artillery warfare churned the earth and exposed the wild seeds to the light, causing them to germinate. The poppy long has been a symbol of death, renewal, and life. It is especially a symbol of WWI, thanks in part to the poem "In Flanders Fields" by John McCrae (from the *Kansas City Star*).
