President's Letter

Each month I try to write about a subject that intrigues me. This month while going through some family papers I came across the Cole County Enterprise from May 9, 1947. The Enterprise is a now defunct newspaper that was published by my wife Cindi's ancestors. What was included in that newspaper on that day still maintains its importance today. Space will not permit printing the entire article. What you see below is my edification.

"What Education Can Do Toward The Maintenance of World Peace" by John Sappenfield

The most perplexing problem of today is that of securing and establishing a world peace. The problem of peace is not a new problem, but rather one that has vexed men since the very beginning of time. Mankind has been negligent in the study of peace; consequently, there has been no solution of maintaining permanent peace. It is a problem which each generation has in its turn failed to solve. ...we must concede that in peace we are still illiterate. Many people will say, "Yes, there is a way of preventing wars." There are those who contend that it cannot be done. Others simply say, "There will always be wars." Some people believe that education is the main element missing in the establishing of peace...

It is true that a materialistic education is not an asset to world peace, but usually a liability, unless it is supplemented with certain ideas of a democratic nature. By democratic ideas, I do not mean that all countries should adopt government like that of the United States. It does mean that people of any society should be taught to respect the rights of others; people should be taught to understand each other, and they should be taught to help each other. If these were taught, a feeling of mutual responsibility would be felt by all. Education along these lines is essential to the permanent maintenance of world peace. "The Ten Commandments" would be sufficient as a text.

The Gettysburg Address 154 Year Ago

There are special observances scheduled for November 18-19, 2017 for the Gettysburg Address. Here is the last paragraph of that famous speech:

But, in a larger sense, we can not dedicate – we can not consecrate – we can not hallow – this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far no nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us – that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion – that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain – that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom – and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.
