If this issue reaches you late it is because I have just returned from a Medal of Honor dedication in Portland, Indiana. I have done many of these over the past 14 years but this one was a little more special than some of the others.

First...Pvt. Louis J. Bruner was solely responsible for the saving of over 600 others from capture or certain death at Walker's Ford, Tennessee in December of 1863, yet his obit and none of the local history books even mention this fete or his award.

Second...The Bruner family had gone different ways after the war and the two family groups had never had a reunion. Actually, they did not even know each other existed. The Bruners in Indiana, all related to Louis's brother, have a reunion every year. Over 200 usually attend. This group did not even know their Gr-Gr-Great Uncle had been awarded a Medal of Honor. In the beginning they were not sure I had the right family.

The Bennett family in Georgia, direct descendants, did not even know there were any Bruners still living in Indiana. These folks knew of the Medal of Honor. In fact, they have both his original Medal and the 1904 Re-issue Medal. They brought them to the ceremony.

Had it not been for the research that was done while setting up this dedication ceremony, these two groups may not have ever met. What a joy it was for me to be there when these two groups met for the very first time. Over 130 years of making up to do!

**Keytesville...**Plan on *departing* the K-Mart parking lot at 24 Hwy & Hwy 291 at 8:30 on Saturday, August 9th. We will travel Hwy 24 east, cross the river at Waverly and plan on arriving at the museum in Keytesville at 10:00. Travel with the group or meet us there.

The plan is to tour the museum, visit the estate and have a group picture taken at the statue of General Price. On the way back we will stop at the Dover Cemetery and find the grave of John Newman Edwards, the famous Civil War writer. And, time permitting, we will stop at the Arnold Cemetery and see where Archie Clements may be buried.

As usual the Picnic was a blast. Those folks living on what was once part of the battlefield thought it was a real blast! Boooooom. Hello-o! Anybody home?

The winners of the egg toss game were the Kesingers, father and son, from Warrensburg. Lots of food on the tables. Luckily, no one brought scrambled eggs.

The visit to the Six Man Cemetery brought out a wide range of thoughts. Do we fix up the site so the vandals will know it there or leave it be, a quiet memorial to the ugliness of the Border War. There were several who indicated a willingness to clean up the site. Most agreed we should not publicize the location but neither should we forget it.

Deadman's Lane in the Butler's Oak Hill Cemetery, the Black Soldiers burial site near Harrisonville, the Order Number 11 Memorial in South Kansas City and the Six Man Cemetery, all a part of our area heritage which is slowly being "progressed" away.

The Prairie Star Schools Civil War Days event video is done. Only 20 copies were made. Only 8 are left. Cost is \$20.00 to CWRTWMo members, \$28.50 to all others.
