CHRISTMAS PARTY



While cleaning up my spare bedroom to make way for a new computer, I found a bunch of items I had forgot I had, including a list of Civil War casualties from Missouri, buried at Corinth, Mississippi, and Shiloh, Tennessee. (Also Nashville, Marietta, and others) The War Department published the "Roll of Honor" in 23 volumes in 1867. For example, the 10th MO Cav has 33 buried in Corinth and two at Shiloh. Information contained on the list reads: Zur Megede, Wm Corp. co G, 10 MO Cav, killed 2-16-1865, Grady Springs, Alabama. I will bring the lists to the next show and tell meeting for anyone who wants to look at them. Call if you need data sooner.

At the December 7 board meeting I will suggest that we consider forming a 3 or more member refreshment committee to handle coffee, soda, cookies, etc. at our meetings. What do you think?
